



President of the SACU

Role Type: Voluntary

Elected Role: The President is nominated by member clubs and elected at the AGM; they will sit for up to a three-year period and may stand for further re-election. The President should ideally be someone who has many years of experience working within the SACU and its committees.

About the Role

The President of the SACU is the titular head of SACU Limited, the limited by guarantee company set up to govern the SACU. In association with the Chairperson, the President will lead the SACU.

About the SACU

The Scottish Auto Cycle Union (SACU) is the National Governing Body for motorcycle sport in Scotland. The SACU develops and promotes a number of motorcycle disciplines including:

- Road Race (inclusive of sidecars)
- Trials
- Off Road Speed (Motocross, Enduro, Quads and Supermoto)
- Bike Trials (non-motorised)

Formed in 1913, the SACU now has over 40 affiliated clubs which organise in excess of 180 events each year for all ages and abilities across 94 permitted venues; some of which are Forestry and Land Scotland partnerships. The SACU issues competition licences, event insurance and provides training for officials and coaches. Each sporting discipline has its own committee, elected by the clubs, to help promote and develop their sport

Key Responsibilities

- Lead SACU Limited in conjunction with the Chairperson and Board of Directors
- In conjunction with the Chairperson and Board of Directors, oversee the successful year on year workings of the SACU Limited
- Be a point of contact for advice and guidance
- Work with the Chairperson to act as a final level of appeal in disciplinary matters
- Work with and encourage links with external organisations in the furtherance of the aims of the SACU



- Work and continue to develop strong working relationships with the ACU and sportscotland
