It's been a busy few months for SACU staff, clubs and volunteers alike. Since our last update in March, SACU clubs from all disciplines have hosted a huge number and variety of events. The SACU have also been working to licence coaches through our newly accredited SCQF qualification. Currently, 2 have successfully completed the process with another 19 ready to qualify in the coming months. Within the Training and Education Framework, the SACU have also recently qualified 10 new First Aiders. In addition to this, the SACU and affiliated clubs have secured new venues and new world champion level riders. Read on to find out more!

SACU Development Team Out and About

The Development Team have been to a number of events over the past few months, they've been working alongside the clubs and event organisers to aid with event planning, promotion and funding applications.

On the 16th of April, Shabaz visited East Fortune Racing Circuit during the Road Race and Side Car Championship. Shabaz and SACU Vice Chair Gordon Dingwall had a very productive discussion about how to develop Road Race and Side Car in Scotland, more details to follow in the next update.

At the end of April, the Development Team travelled to Kinlochleven and Fort William to visit the organising clubs of the Pre'65 and Scottish Six Day Trials. During their visit, they discussed how they could support future events and have begun putting plans in place for 2023.

At the beginning of May Shabaz visited the Quad and Side Car Racing event at Duns Motocross Track where a planning meeting for next year's event took place. There is a lot of exciting development in this area so keep your eyes peeled!



In June, Gillian and Shabaz attended The Drumlanrig Offroad Motorsport Festival where they helped with media liaison, coordinating castle tours and promoting the sport to festival goers. First Aid

The Development Team delivered an Emergency First Aid at Work (EFAW) course to 10 club members from KORMC in June. Following their successful completion, the newly qualified EFAW First Aiders can act as First Responders in several situations requiring basic first aid which will help support casualties with minor injuries in addition to those with major conditions until emergency help arrives.

With a minimum requirement of 7 hours teaching time, the EFAW qualification can be split over multiple sessions and designed to suit the group. If you would like to arrange a course for your club or workplace, please contact Shabaz.khan@sacu.co.uk

The programme provides sport development experiences to university students within a range of subjects including sports management, event management and tourism. In May, Glasgow Caledonian University student Alessandro Mazza joined the development team where he worked closely with Kenny Harper from The Galloway Motorcycle Club to promote the Drumlanrig Offroad Motorsport Festival online. Following completion of the 2022 event, Alessandro has now shifted his focus towards working with the club and Shabaz to create a social media strategy for 2023. Additionally, Alessandro will work with the Development Team and SACU Chair, Sandy Mack, to plan and deliver the FIME Trials Championship Round in August.
