

Licence Restrictions for those new to Road Racing in Scotland 2026

Choice of licence – 18 and over – Clubman or Clubman Intermediate; 12 to 17 Youths - Clubman

Adults (18 and over)	New to racing, no licence or restricted licence to ride a motorcycle on the public roads. Select CLUBMAN	Restricted to:- Up to Formula / Supersport 600 600cc four stroke, 675cc triple 4 stroke Production based machine. Up to 250cc GP machine. All Machines listed in Scottish Lightweights. 650cc Classic bike.
<i>After National Licence obtained (after 10 signatures, 3 circuits), Unlimited cc.</i>

SIDECARS

There are **no restrictions for ADULT sidecar drivers or passengers.**

Drivers can compete at 17 years old on Formula 2, Formula 350, Classic, Vintage or Morgan 3-wheeler sidecar. Unlimited 4-stroke or 2 stroke machine.

Passengers can compete at 16 years old on Formula 1, Formula 2, Formula 350, Classic, Vintage or Morgan 3-wheeler sidecar. Unlimited 4-stroke or 2 stroke machine.

PARADE

Unusual occurrence in Scotland, Adults are unrestricted. Youths 14 year old and over, can only ride a machine that their licence grade allows.
