
# SACU Quarterly Activity Report

### Officials Training

Between October and December, 19 officials from Trials, Enduro and Motocross have either achieved their SACU Official's License for the first time or renewed their existing ones.



We are pleased to say the total for the year is now 114 across all off-road disciplines. #### Coaching Motorcycle Sport Level 2

During the month of November, we ran our SACU Coaching Motorcycle Sport (Level 2) qualification with 8 participants. These participants were spread over Trials, Motocross and Enduro. This took place at Cardenden Motocross Track, and we would like to say a big thank you to Kingdom Off Road for allowing us to use their venue for the course.

The course was split into 2 online sessions as well as a full day of practical delivery and a day of First Aid training. The online sessions included content about feedback models, session structure, different types of communication and effective coaching practices. Throughout the course, the participants had to complete various assignments that were aimed at how to plan a coaching session, a coach's roles and responsibilities and the candidate's own coaching style. In addition to these assignments, they also had to complete their Child Wellbeing and Protection in Sport (CWPS) training and Inclusive Practice training. We would also like to say a big thank you to all participants for your time and effort throughout November and congratulations on gaining your qualification!

Our Level 2 Coaching Course is open to anyone who is interested. To give you a bit of insight into the expectations and content of the course please read below.

The course will be split into online sessions followed by some tasks as well as two full days of classroom and practical delivery. The Emergency First Aid at Work qualification is also included within the price and requires 7 hours of classroom time; this can be split or delivered in one go to best suit your needs. An overview of the course has been presented below. The cost of the course is £175, and we are flexible when it comes to start dates/venues. #### First Aid Training

On Sunday the 12<sup>th</sup> of November, 5 participants successfully completed their Emergency First Aid at Work (EFAW) qualification. Candidates from the two disciplines of Enduro and Motocross took part, with the youngest of our successful first aiders being 16 years old. The course is normally delivered over 1 day but can be split into two separate sessions to suit candidates needs/preferences. The qualification covers a number of subjects such as CPR, safe use of an AED, how to deal with burns, minor injuries, major bleeds and more. Well done to everyone who took part and achieved their EFAW qualification!

#### **EFAW**

Last year, the Development Team delivered the Emergency First Aid at Work (EFAW) qualification to SACU affiliated clubs. Following successful completion of the course, newly qualified EFAW First Aiders can act as First Responders in several situations requiring basic first aid which will help support casualties with minor injuries in addition to those with major conditions until emergency help arrives.

## UK Anti-Doping (UKAD): Tramadol ban during Competition from 2024

There is now under a month to go until the World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA) 2024 List of Prohibited Substances and Methods in Sports comes into effect. One of the major modifications to the 2024 List is that WADA will prohibit Tramadol in-competition. In response to this change, UKAD has developed a new Therapeutic Use Exemption (TUE) Position Statement that sets out guidance for how athletes and doctors should comply with the changes to the way Tramadol will be regulated in sport. As motorcycle sport athletes are not considered part of the 'National TUE Pool,' the following applies:

#### Retroactive TUE Procedure

Athletes who are not defined to be within the National TUE Pool for their sport nor are defined to be international level do not need to be in possession of a valid TUE prior to commencing treatment with a prohibited substance or method. However, such athletes should check with their prescribing doctor prior to starting treatment that:

- the need to use the prohibited substance or method is necessary to treat the diagnosed medical condition
- the diagnosis is supported by relevant clinical evidence such as investigations, clinical examinations, and/or test results
- no permitted alternatives exist (the status of other possible treatment options can be assessed using <u>Global</u> DRO).

Athletes have five working days to make a retroactive TUE application following receiving written notification from UKAD that they have returned an AAF.
