

Treasurer of the SACU

Role Type: Voluntary

Appointment: The Treasurer is an appointed role within the Board Structure nominated by the Board of Directors. They should be suitably experienced to carry out their role.

About the Role

The SACU Management Committee is responsible for the management and organisation of the SACU and its assets. The Treasurer is responsible for overseeing and managing ALL financial elements of the SACU.

About the SACU

The Scottish Auto Cycle Union (SACU) is the National Governing Body for motorcycle sport in Scotland. The SACU develops and promotes a number of motorcycle disciplines including:

- Road Race (inclusive of sidecars)
- Trials
- Off Road Speed (Motocross, Enduro, Quads and Supermoto
- Bike Trials (non-motorised)

Formed in 1913, the SACU now has over 40 affiliated clubs which organise in excess of 180 events each year for all ages and abilities across 94 permitted venues; some of which are Forestry and Land Scotland partnerships. The SACU issues competition licences, event insurance and provides training for officials and coaches. Each sporting discipline has its own committee, elected by the clubs, to help promote and develop their sport

Key Responsibilities

- To manage the finances and fiscal policy of the SACU and its inherent processes
- Develop, monitor and review the Financial Policy and Processes of the SACU
- Develop a risk management plan ensuring a solid financial basis year on year
- Ensure annual accounts and reports are submitted to the Accountants in time for the AGM
- Ensure the SACU conforms to the Financial Laws relevant to society in Scotland
- Work closely with other directors to ensure that the SACU operates as cost effectively as possible



- Build and encourage relationships with all necessary external organisations
- Represent the SACU at meetings and seminars that fall under the Treasurers remit

Expenses

The post is voluntary although travel and meeting expenses will be reimbursed according to the SACU Constitution.
