



Vice President of the SACU

Role Type: Voluntary

Elected Role: Vice-Presidents are nominated by member clubs and elected at the AGM; they will sit for a one, two or three-year period and may stand for further re-election.

About the Role

The Vice-Presidents are elected to support the Chairperson, President, Company Secretary and Treasurer in the execution of their duties.

About the SACU

The Scottish Auto Cycle Union (SACU) is the National Governing Body for motorcycle sport in Scotland. The SACU develops and promotes a number of motorcycle disciplines including:

- Road Race (inclusive of sidecars)
- Trials
- Off Road Speed (Motocross, Enduro, Quads and Supermoto)
- Bike Trials (non-motorised)

Formed in 1913, the SACU now has over 40 affiliated clubs which organise in excess of 180 events each year for all ages and abilities across 94 permitted venues; some of which are Forestry and Land Scotland partnerships. The SACU issues competition licences, event insurance and provides training for officials and coaches. Each sporting discipline has its own committee, elected by the clubs, to help promote and develop their sport

Key Responsibilities

- To assist the senior directors in the execution of the duties necessary for the effective running of the SACU
- Work in conjunction with the senior directors in delegated tasks
- Encourage positive behaviours in line with the ethics of the SACU
- Work with and encourage links with external organisations in the furtherance of the aims of the SACU



Expenses
