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The SACU Safeguarding Charter 2020

All sporting agencies in Scotland are required to provide adequate provision for the Wellbeing and Protection of young people in sport, we are no exception to this.

This document sets out in simple terms what everyone involved in motorcycle sport in Scotland can expect from the SACU and their peer groups in the course of their sport. Socially, we are all responsible for the Wellbeing and Protection of Young People, we are all responsible for making our sport as safe and secure as it can be.

Our commitments are guided by the **SHANARRI** Principles

Safe, Healthy, Achieving, Nurtured, Active, Respected, Responsible and Included

The SACU's Commitments

To our members and volunteers, it is our commitment as an organisation:

- To promote the health and wellbeing of young people within motorcycle sport
- To respect and promote the rights, wishes and feelings of young people.
- To implement appropriate procedures to safeguard the wellbeing of young people
- To encourage and facilitate the input from young people into our sports
- Require staff and volunteers to adopt and abide by our Child Protection Policy and its procedures.
- To respond to any allegations of misconduct or abuse of young people in line with our Policy and procedures

In addition to the commitments above expect us:

- To recruit, train, support our staff, Coaches and officials to adopt best practice in safeguarding and protecting young people
- To continue developing our training module to ensure that our officials understand their responsibilities to our young people
- Encourage young people to participate in the function of the SACU

The SACU also expects our members and young people to

- Treat everyone involved equally, with respect, dignity and fairness.
- Collectively make our sport fun, enjoyable and promote fair play.
- Include and mentor young people in the decision-making process where possible.
- Put the wellbeing of each child first
- We expect adults to be excellent role models to our young people
